


Green Class 'Home Learning' Autumn 1 - 2017

Challenge:

Now that you have your information can you transfer the information into either a pictogram or block graph? Which way do you think is the clearest way to present your information?

Everything Royal!

Choose a member of the Royal Family, either past or present, and make a fact sheet or poster outlining what you have found out.

Things to possibly research:

- When they lived
- How long they reigned for
- What they're known for
- What did they wear
- What did they eat

Challenge:

Instead of a poster you make a small information booklet using headings for each section. Remember to use capital letters and full stops and conjunctions (and, because) to extend your sentences.

Family Tree

Have fun researching your own family tree. Who were your great grandparents? What did they do? Where did they live? Think of creative ways of presenting your family tree... the more imaginative the better ☺

Challenge:

Make a timeline of significant events that have happened in your family's history.

Tea anyone?

Practise your culinary skills and design (or make) afternoon tea that would be fit for the Queen. Consider what she may like to drink and what kind of sandwiches she may like (maybe you could design your own filling to tempt her away from cucumber sandwiches!)

Challenge:
