


Green Class 'Home Learning' Spring Term 1 - 2018

Can you research the different temperatures in countries/cities around the world?

Pick a day to do your research on:

- *Write the day you chose.
- *Write the name of the place.
- *Write the time in that place.
- *Write the temperature there.

You might want to write them on a map? Or in a table? You might want to draw pictures to show what it's like in that country?

Challenge:

Which is the hottest place?
Which is the coldest place? Can you explain why you think these places are such different temperatures?

Explorers Adventures!

David Livingstone was a famous explorer who ventured across Africa.

He had to be very brave and courageous!

Choose a country or location you would like to explore in the world.
Tell us about your expedition!

You might want to:

- *Draw a map of where you would travel; through tropical rainforests, traipsing through hot sandy deserts etc...
- *Write a list of items you would take with you and why.
- *Draw pictures of what you see on your adventure.

Challenge:

Write a diary of your adventures.
Remember it's your diary so write in first person!

Antarctica Art...

Did you know that in Antarctica instead of seeing the Northern Lights they see the Southern Lights! It is a spectacular, colourful light show in the sky.

Can you create a picture of the Southern Lights (Aurora Australis)?

You might want to use:

- *felt tips *crayons *paints *pastels

Or you might want to create a colourful collage? You could use magazines/newspapers to find bright colours to fill the sky!

Challenge:

Can you use a mixture of materials to create your art work? Creating different textures.

Penguin Problems!

A penguin is not just a penguin. There are MANY different types of penguins!

Can you investigate and make a fact sheet about all the different types? You might want to add these details:

- *Name of penguin?
- *What height do they grow to?
- *Most common?
- *Least common?
- *Where do they all live?
- *What do they look like?
- *Do they eat the same things?

Challenge:

Can you order the penguins from shortest to tallest? What is the difference in height between the shortest and tallest? How much taller are you?
