Learning / Lesson ideas	 Share a simple story of creation with the children. Children to link the story of creation to growing. Children to grow their own plants/flowers and take care of them. Linking to looking after the world that God created. Give children a piece of dough and they need to create something. Children to share what they have created. Link to God creating the world. 	 Children to perform a Christmas Nativity. Children to listen to a range of books telling the story of the first Christmas. Children to learn religious Christmas songs / traditional Christmas rhymes. 	 Children to take part in the whole school Easter activities. Children to learn songs / rhymes about Easter. Children to go on an Easter hunt and look for new life. Children to share what they do at Easter time. Children to create Easter cards. 	 Share the story of Noah's Ark over 4 sessions. Children to learn songs / rhymes related to the story of Noah. Noah's Ark small world. Share different versions / story books of Noah's Ark. 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Possible hooks and key questions	 Introduce 2 imaginary Christian twins 'Tessa' & 'Tom'. What is a VIP? How many days did God take to create the World? Why do you think the sky is blue? What questions can you ask about the things you can see? How do Christians talk to God? What is prayer? Who has been to a harvest festival? How would you decorate your name to make it look special? 	Show 3 photos of individual pupils. > What do you think they might be good at? > Do we know? We don't know what they will be good at just by looking at them and people did not think Jesus was special on the outside. > What was special about Christmas? > What else did you find out about the Christmas story?	 Take in an 'Easter Lunchbox' (contain chocolate eggs, pancakes and hot cross buns). Discuss with the class: do you think these are the most important things about Easter? If they drew a picture of the most important thing about Easter what would it be? Can you think of another time you have seen a cross? Can you make your own cross? 	 Take in a boat/ark, pairs of animals, tray of water. What are these? What could they be for? What do you think about the stories? What do the stories tell us about God/Jesus? 	 Take a walk in the local community to see signs of religion, what can they spot and how this links to different religions. Can you explain why people go on a pilgrimage? Look at pictures of Buddhist temples. What are these? How are they different to a church?
